Don't forget to check your furnace/heating systems as well as smoke and carbon dioxide detectors to make sure they are ready and in good working condition (i.e., change filters, inspection, change batteries if needed, etc.) as well as remove outside hoses from spicket so won't freeze/break. Another thing to check for are any pipe exposures that could potentially freeze should we experience any extreme cold weather. It's never fun to wake up to frozen pipes or no heat when the cold hits.

Residents can dispose of these items at the village dump which is located at the corner of Lisman Lane and Oak Hill Street.

Fire Hydrants: It is illegal to block fire hydrants with snow or any other debris.


Cemetery Reminders
